A LIFE OF SERVICE

ED JACOB

CLASS OF 1977

Ed Jacob '77 is a true example of taking what he learned at Central Catholic and using it to make an impact in his community and in the world. After being introduced to volunteering and community service when he was a student at CCHS, he spent nearly 40 years working in non-profit organizations that focus on serving others.

After earning a degree in economics, political science, and urban affairs at Marquette University, Ed joined the Jesuit Volunteer Corps for one year. The experience involved service and social justice, and living a simple life of poverty with a spiritual component. His assignment took him to Chicago, where he worked with five other people.

Once his year was up, he stayed in Chicago and started working at Voice of the People, an organization that rehabilitated apartment buildings for low income individuals. He then worked for a social service community center, followed by a community development credit union where he worked with people who didn't have bank accounts. He taught them about financial literacy, loans, tax returns, and savings accounts to help them grow and get out of their situations. He went on to work for Neighborhood Housing Services in Chicago, an organization that built homes and sold them to low income families.

Ed's most recent job was with the Franciscan Outreach homeless shelter, which actually consists of three



individual shelters, including one for people who were living in encampments.

“It’s difficult to get people who live in encampments into shelters because shelters don’t allow many of the things they have in their encampments,” he explained. “One of the Franciscan Outreach shelters allows ‘partners, pets, and possessions,’ so we were able to get more people out of encampments that way.”

Ed is now retired, but he continues his servant leadership on the board of a homeless shelter foundation, and through the Catholic Campaign for Human Development and other volunteer activities.

“When I look back on my career, I realize that my service was rooted at Central Catholic,” Ed said. “The diversity at CCHS, the community engagement and community partnerships, Fr. Marty Donnelly, and a social justice class that I had with Fr. Jeff Sikorski all really resonated with me. At Central Catholic, I learned how to treat people with respect no matter who they are, whether they are the principal or a homeless person on the street. I love how Central Catholic has physically stayed in the community and continues to be engaged in the neighborhood. I feel lucky to have attended Central Catholic, and I’m forever grateful for the people and my experiences there.”

Having a career dedicated to serving others can definitely be hard work, but Ed says it’s very rewarding. “You meet great people, and you get back so much more than you give. It makes you realize that people have the same kinds of problems and challenges that you do, and that you could be in their situation if you didn’t have your family, friends, and experiences. You make real connections with people, both those you serve and the volunteers you serve along with. You get to know people as individuals. It’s a lot easier to dislike someone you haven’t met.”

Now that he’s retired, Ed can spend more time with his family. His wife, **Laurie (Devine) Jacobs** is a **1978** CCHS graduate, although they didn’t actually know each other in high school. They met when they both attended Marquette and they drove back to Toledo together to save gas money. Laurie works as a nurse in Chicago. They have three grown children - Katherine (34), Anna (30), and Henry (25).

Ed will always appreciate his Central Catholic roots, and pointed out how many CCHS people have gone on to change the world. “If I’ve done anything well, if I’ve made a difference or helped anyone, at least a little bit of that is from Central Catholic. Multiply that by all the alumni who have impacted the world because of their experiences at CCHS. I always think of that quote by Bobby Kennedy. Emanating from Central Catholic are the tiny ripples of hope for a better future for our city, state, country, and our world.” 🍀

Central Catholic High School has been an important member of the Toledo community for 102 years. Being part of this community comes with certain responsibilities, including developing students who understand the significance of serving our community, and partnering with other local organizations to make our community a better place.

Building Servant Leaders

The Catholic faith calls us to perform acts of charity to strengthen others and for our own spiritual growth, and community service is something that is built into the curriculum at Central Catholic. Although students are required to complete a specific number of service hours, many go above and beyond the requirements as they experience the rewards of helping others. **Last year, our students provided 26,000 hours of service to our community!**

Students are required to complete hours in direct service, leadership, and/or justice awareness, immersion, and advocacy. Leadership service can be done by students taking on leadership roles through retreats, clubs, churches and outside organizations, school functions, and sports. Justice awareness, immersion, and advocacy involves identity awareness, systems of injustice awareness, civic engagement, diversity and inclusion awareness, and faithful citizenship.

Students can achieve their service hours in the classroom with teachers, on the court or field with coaches, in small mentorship groups, and inside or outside school.

Required hours of service:

- Freshmen - 10 hours
- Sophomores - 15 hours
- Juniors - 20 hours
- Seniors - 25 hours

Our students perform service throughout the community, improving their own sense of social responsibility while impacting the lives of others. They often do service projects over the summer, such as volunteering at summer camps, staffing community events, tutoring for Summer Success classes at Central Catholic, or working for the YES Project (a 4-day community service project that helps maintain or improve the physical living situations for those who are unable to do so themselves).

Students also perform service throughout the school year, such as working at their parish events, helping



neighbors, tutoring, and attending the March For Life. Students complete many service projects in Central Catholic's Kindness Room, which is specifically dedicated to spreading kindness by making cards and writing letters to other students, teachers and staff members, nursing homes, hospital patients, military members, Mobile Meals recipients, and more.

"As a Catholic school, we find in the Gospel that every time we help another person, we help Jesus," said Fr. David Kidd, Central Catholic's Priest Leader. "We teach our students to see Jesus in those who we serve and to be Jesus for others. The Class of 2022 performed over \$200,000 worth of community service during their four years here. The impact of that kind of service is seen in the relationships we have built with community partners right here in Toledo."



Developing Community Partnerships

Central Catholic works closely with several organizations in the surrounding neighborhood, as well as others throughout the Toledo area. These partnerships benefit both CCHS and the community in several ways. Businesses and nonprofit organizations often complement the skills students are building in class, and working with them enables students to see and experience these workplaces and service providers to learn about opportunities available to them in the future. Community partners help us build well-educated and empathetic citizens ready to take on responsibilities as contributing community members.

Our community partners are businesses and non-profit organizations that support Central Catholic financially, offer academic and career preparation for our students, and/or provide servant leadership opportunities.

Some of these partners include:

The Andersons - Supports Central Catholic financially.

Catholic Club - Students collect coloring books, crayons, and markers to deliver to the club for children to use.

CYO - Students work as referees for elementary school games. CCHS hosts CYO basketball games in the Sullivan Center.

Lourdes University - CCHS students attended a leadership summit at the university in October. Lourdes also partners with CCHS to offer college credit for two classes that seniors can take at Central Catholic.

Mareda Center - CCHS students tutor neighborhood children at the facility.

Mercy College - Representatives attend Central Catholic's yearly Science Expo to advise students and judge their science projects, and they participate in our college and career fair to talk about scholarship and educational opportunities.

Mercy Foundation - Supports the Central Catholic scholarship fund.

Mercy Health - CCHS students visit St. Vincent Mercy Hospital right next door on Cherry Street for hands-on learning experiences with careers in the health field. We partner with Mercy Health for athletic trainers and substitute school nurses.

Mom's House - CCHS has collected items to be used at the childcare center that helps low-income, single



moms graduate from high school and college.

Ronald McDonald House - Students collect pull tabs from aluminum cans throughout the school year and take them to RMH to be recycled. RMH uses the funds they receive from the recycled aluminum to help purchase food for guests who stay at the facility.

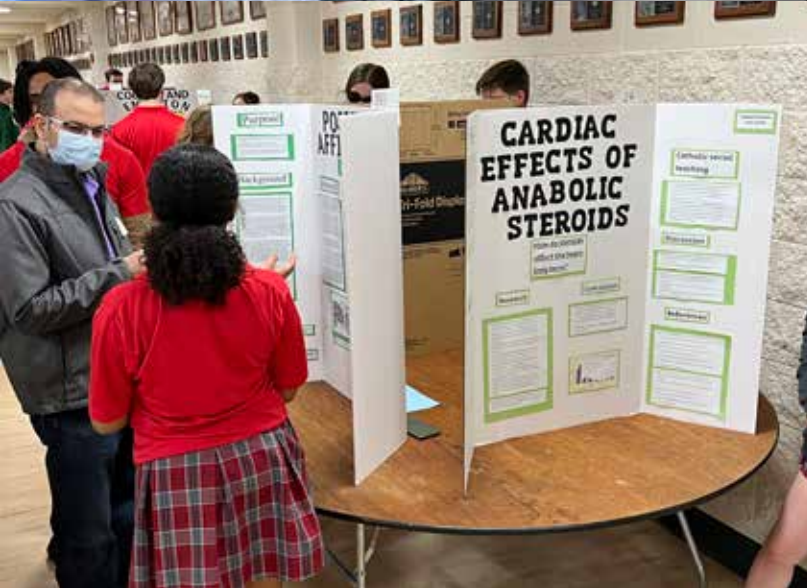
Signature Bank - Supports the Central Catholic scholarship fund.

Toledo Community Foundation - Supports Central Catholic financially.

University of Toledo - Our students work with students from the University of Toledo each year to put on the IrishTHON, a dance marathon to benefit the Children's Miracle Network. UToledo representatives come to Central Catholic to speak to students about programs and career opportunities and help our students apply for college.

“At Central Catholic, our goal is to prepare students to go beyond high school and into a successful career and an impactful life,” said Eric Stockard, Central Catholic's Vice President for Institutional Advancement. “What we do inside and outside our building is designed to educate the whole student - mind, body, and soul.”

Central Catholic will continue its mission of preparing future leaders for many years to come. Serving the community and maintaining our community partnerships will always be important in the development of our students as we carry out this mission. ✻





Krompak Honored by Central Catholic as a Trailblazer for Girls' Athletics

Central Catholic High School honored **Fran Krompak '58** as a trailblazer for girls' athletics with the unveiling of a tribute display in the school's Sullivan Center on September 11. Fran was in attendance with her family members and special guests.

Fran was a pioneer for girls' basketball across the state, opening the door for other women to coach in northwest Ohio. She had a 140-25 record as the first female coach at Central Catholic, and she was the first female coach in the City League. Her record includes eight Toledo City League titles, two sectional titles, two district championships, one regional championship, and one state final four appearance during her tenure from 1969-80. She also coached

tennis, volleyball, and cheerleading at CCHS and served as a teacher and guidance counselor, working for a total of 42 years at her alma mater.

In 1987, Fran was the first woman to be inducted into the Central Catholic Athletic Hall of Fame. She was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame in April 2022 and is also a member of the City League Hall of Fame, the Birmingham Hall of Fame, and the District 7 Basketball Hall of Fame.

Fran retired from working at Central Catholic in 2004, but that hasn't kept her away from Cherry Street! She still enjoys attending events and rooting on the Irish from the stands on a regular basis.

The trailblazer display unveiled in

the Central Catholic Sullivan

Center includes memorabilia from Fran's tenure as a coach, and it features a video honoring her accomplishments, with testimonials from former players, coaches, and administrators.

During the event, Central Catholic announced that the school's Front Gym, which was where it all began for Fran and where she left her mark on girls' athletics, will now be known as **Krompak Hall**. Central Catholic will also establish the Fran Krompak Scholarship Fund to honor Fran and to support CCHS students far into the future.

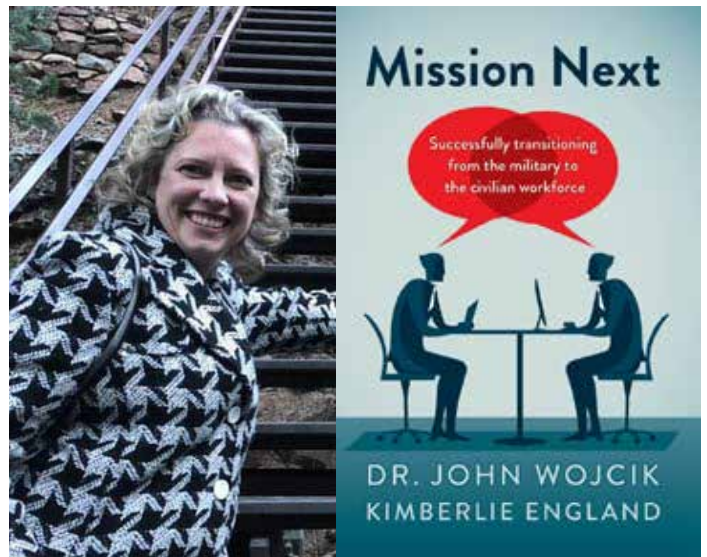

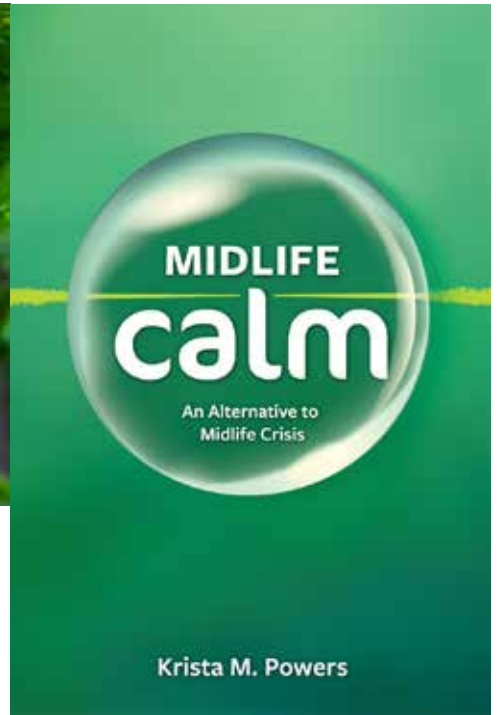

GIVING SPOTLIGHT

Howard Gordon, Class of 1978

In the long history of Central Catholic High School, many alumni have used their wills to make financial donations or leave property to the school. They often choose to do so because of the impact CCHS or specific teachers had on their lives. **Howard Gordon '78** fits this description, but in his case, he made his plans earlier than most people do.

Howard is just 62 years old. He recently had a friend die in an accident at the age of 60, which really made him think. He decided to get his will done to make sure everything is taken care of according to his wishes, even though he plans to be around for many more years. He chose to leave half his estate to Central Catholic to help students with tuition so they can have the same experiences that he had in school. When he passes, the funds will go into a scholarship endowment.

As a student at Central Catholic, Howard was a member of the band and the Spanish Club. He also worked at CCHS after school and during the summer to help pay for his tuition, doing maintenance and janitorial work. "My mom was a single mother and worked a lot, but I met so many good people at CCHS, both students and teachers, and I credit them for helping to keep me out of trouble," he explained. He specifically remembers Sister Xavier, Sister Damien, and Sister Adolphine in the math department, Merrie-Ellen Vogan in English, Bob Sturek in social studies and driver's education, and Fr. Nassr and Fr. Marty Donnelly - all as good role models and good people.

Howard went on to the University of Toledo and earned a degree in business in 1982. Throughout college and for a few years after, he continued to work at Central Catholic doing maintenance and groundskeeping. During this time, he really got to know the teachers from a different perspective, and he appreciated them even more.

While he was working at Central Catholic, he was asked to teach a semester of Spanish to cover for someone who went on maternity leave. That experience helped him decide that he really wanted to be a teacher, so he got his teaching certificate. He went on to teach Spanish for 10 years at St. John's Jesuit before moving to Denver, Colorado in 1995. He got his master's degree in Spanish from the University of Northern Colorado, and he taught Spanish in Denver until his retirement in 2015. He is still a substitute teacher, and he also enjoys traveling.

Howard is happy to be in a position to give back to Central Catholic and to help students the way he was helped. His story is a reminder that estate planning can happen at any time. You don't have to wait until you're "old" to make plans. As Howard said, "Do it when you're still sound in body and mind, and you're not in the middle of a crisis. It's easier to get it done and do it right."

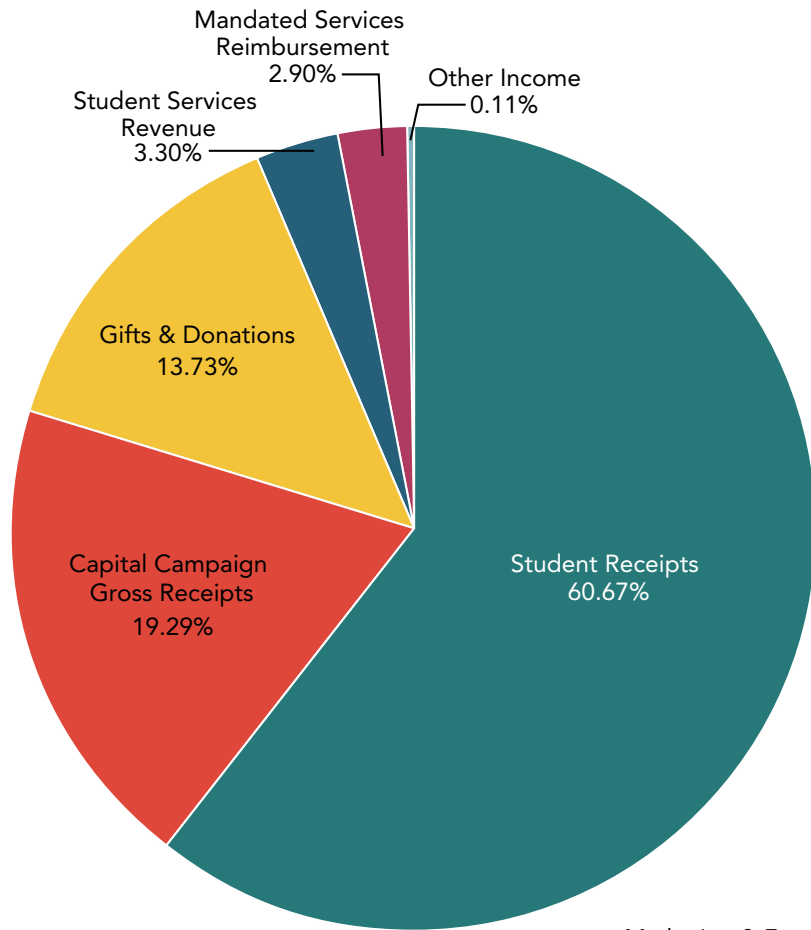


Kathleen Hamilton - Assistant Principal and Principal

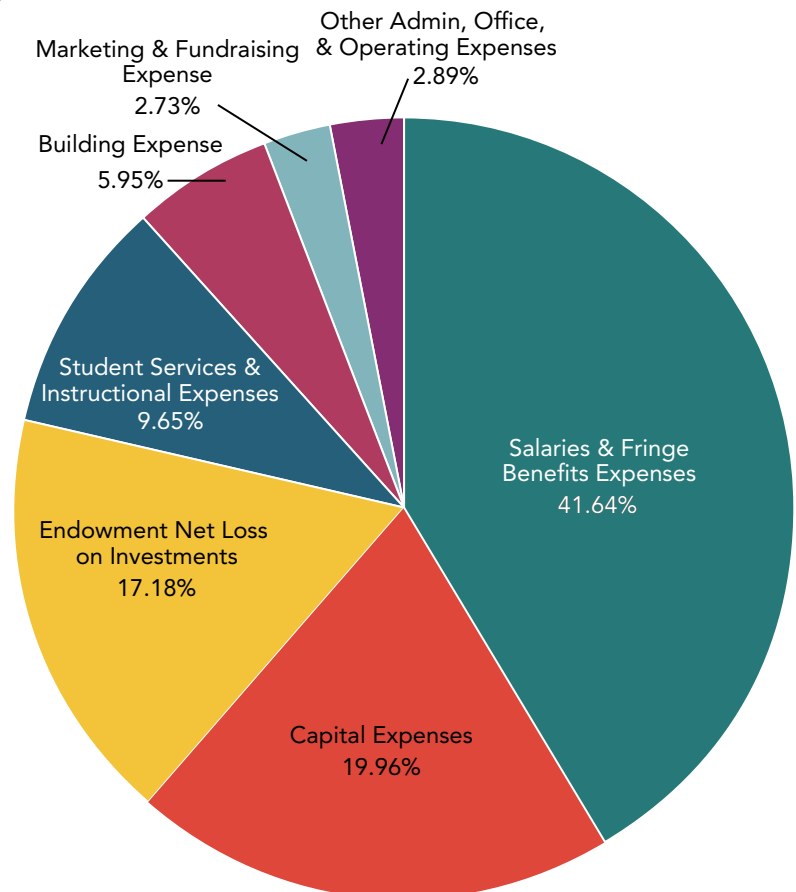

Student receipts of tuition and fees amounted to 60% of our annual income, followed by gifts and donations of over 30% from our generous Irish Family. Thank you, again, to everyone who has supported our annual and capital campaign funds!

Like the vast majority of organizations, the school's largest expenses are related to salaries, payroll taxes, and fringe benefits. The aforementioned costs accounted for over 40% of all expenses. After investing in our people, we spent another 20% on capital improvements to the building and 10% on costs directly relating to our students and their experience as a Central Catholic student. We look forward to finding new ways to support our faculty, staff, admin, and students in meaningful ways in the coming years.

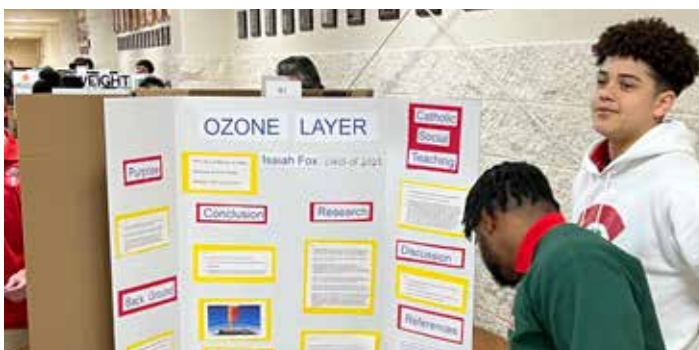

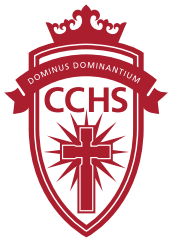
